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Dr. Terry Flowers Begins 30th Year of Service with St. Philip's Ministry

St. Philip's School & Community Center and South Dallas' Forest Heights neighborhood has experienced significant growth and accomplishment in the last three decades. Much of this is due to the vision and leadership of Executive Director/Headmaster, Dr. Terry J. Flowers, who will mark his 30th year of service with St. Philip's in January.

For thirty years, Dr. Flowers has spearheaded change at 1600 Pennsylvania Avenue in South Dallas; serving at first as principal of the School that in 1984 ended at Kindergarten. Our School now serves students grades PK2 through 6th Grade, ages 2 – 12. The Community Center has grown from providing solely a South Dallas youth athletics program to numerous educational, recreational, health and social services for children, youth, families, and senior citizens residing in South Dallas, Oak Cliff, and Pleasant Grove.



His experiences as an educator in the tough urban communities of his hometown of Chicago and Harlem, New York shaped his belief in the need for holistic efforts to address the erosion of inner-city neighborhoods. His leadership led to the establishment of curriculum for St. Philip's which emphasizes academic excellence, a positive self-image and a faith-based focus for life. Alongside the strong academic program are numerous collaborative social services and community development activities which have been crucial to the revitalization of our neighborhood and neighbors. This broad-based approach has established St. Philip's as a model for inner-city schools – public, charter and private.

To witness Dr. Flowers in action is to recognize he is one of those rarities – a wise and humble man who is obediently fulfilling his life's calling. Under his leadership, an entire community is improving one block, one family at a time.

We are thankful for our "good shepherd" of St. Philip's School and Community Center and look forward to honoring his incomparable and dedicated service throughout the school year.

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2013 Wisdom Warrior Summer Program Met Dire Community Need

For years, St. Philip's summer program has met the critical educational, nutritional, social, fitness, spiritual, and safety needs of children and youth in South Dallas, many of whom would be home alone if our summer program didn't exist.

St. Philip's was able to provide over 100 children and youth (ages 5 – 14) with healthy meals, academic enrichment, exciting field trips, loving care, quality arts classes, and a safe haven for eight weeks. Also, given the tremendous support St. Philip's received through generous grants and a major donor, the 2013 Wisdom Warrior Summer Program was offered at no cost to families! This was a first for St. Philip's because we traditionally provide simply a low-cost program. This year, we proved to meet a dire need, as 90% of our "little warriors" reside in poor and low-income households with multiple children where even a minimal fee would not be feasible.



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What's New at St. Philip's

ST. PHILIP'S PRESCHOOL **PROGRAM KICKS OFF "UNIVERSITY" FORMAT**

This school year, St. Philip's kicked off the brainchild of **Principal** Gwendolyn Barjon-a new Pre-K University program format. The School's preschool program includes grades PreK2 through Kindergarten students, ages 2 to 5 and has always provided a dynamic



St. Philip's Crystal Charity Ball Early Childhood Wing is now equipped with a technology lab, science lab, and geography/ social studies lab where our precious, inquisitive preschoolers engage in "purposeful" play for their formative minds. Two reading specialists and math specialists instruct students daily and a Spanish instructor was recently hired specifically to instruct preschool students. Also, students take bi-weekly enrichment classes in Library, P.E., Music, and Art.

In recent years, there has been an increased local and national demand for quality Early Childhood programs located in inner city communities. A recent study from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) says that quality early childhood education results in successful students, responsible adults and stronger communities. For years, St. Philip's has seen such results through our own Early Childhood program and looks forward to providing an innovative model for Early Childhood education in the coming years.

Generous support for St. Philip's Early Childhood program has been provided this year by the Harry W. Bass Foundation and Harold Simmons Foundation.

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St. Philip's Integrates New **Curriculum and Non-Students** in After School Care Program St. Philip's After School Program has traditionally offered not

only an affordable (and in some cases free) safe, nurturing environment but a combination of hands-on, exciting education and youth development activities; all hallmarks of high quality programs. We recognize effective after school programs - especially for our demographic - must include both academic and non-academic classes, extended hours, healthy meals, and in some cases, social services.


To that end, St. Philip's has embraced the idea of "integration" and now offers the St. Philip's Arts and Academic Afterschool Care Enrichment or S.P.A3.C.E program to half of its student body and dozens of children who attend neighborhood public schools. IV "Eve" Holmes-Busby, S.P.A3.C.E.'s Director, has established an inventive program reinforcing academics, while integrating arts, service learning, culture, mentoring, and athletics programming.

St. Philip's School & Community Center received grants from The Harold Simmons Foundation and the Dallas Foundation to support the implementation of the expanded After School Care program.

Prior to this year, St. Philip's offered two separate After School Care programs – one for students and one for non-students. The S.P.A3.C.E. format enables all of the children to benefit from every activity, from capoeira, a Brazilian martial arts and dance, to creative writing or math club to mentoring. Also, children needing to remain in our care as late as 8 pm will be tutored, fed a nutritious, hot dinner and participate in additional classes.
